The beautiful Skye and Lochalsh area has a long association with creativity. From the Mesolithic and Iron Age inhabitants who left behind evidence of stone carving and metalwork, to a legacy of Gaelic song and weaving traditions, it is an area rich in cultural heritage. It is no surprise that many artists and makers have either chosen to make this inspirational place their home, or that it continues to inspire those who visit.

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

In the 1980s, a small group of craft makers and artists living in the North West of Skye began working together at local craft markets. A starter grant from the local development board helped them to develop and extend the initiative, and from this, **Skye and Lochalsh Arts & Crafts Association** was born. Amongst the founder members, Stuart Whatley (Edinbane Pottery) and Cathy Myhill (Dandelion Designs) are still very much involved with the group today. Then as now, the groups aims are to promote and support artists and craft makers in the area.

THEN AS NOW

Skye and Lochalsh Arts & Crafts Association is an unincorporated membership organization, which means that we do not operate for profit and we are run by—and for - **YOU** the members.

We are proud of the diversity and quality of creative work produced by our membership, and now represent around 40 artists and makers in the Skye and Lochalsh area including painters, photographers, weavers, knitters, jewellery makers, spinners, textile artists, printmakers, ceramic artists and sculptors.

The **Art-Skye** Guide is a geographic trail linking the galleries, studios and exhibition spaces of our members across Skye and Lochalsh. It is the perfect showcase for the amazing range of our members creative activity, and offers visitors the perfect tool for discovery!

Its production is funded entirely by participating SLACA members, receiving no financial assistance from any public or funding body and no sponsorship from any self-interested third party.

The collectable pocket sized printed **Art-Skye** booklet contains illustrated information for member studios, workshops and galleries, numbered location maps , an index with sat nav codes, an easy video link and a comprehensive glossary. Work on the booklet starts each year around Nov/Dec with printing aimed to co-incide with the start of the main tourist season at Easter.

Over 15,000 printed copies are distributed and made available for visitors to pick up **FREE** from accommodation providers, cafes & restaurants, selected retail outlets, and of course from members own studios, galleries and workshops.

YOUR COMMITTEE



CHAIR: Peter McDermott Aird Old Church Gallery

I've been painting watercolours and producing graphics on Skye since 1996 - that's nearly 26 years, gosh where have the years gone! Before moving to Skye with my young family, I attended the West Surrey College of Art and Design and entered the world of advertising and marketing in 1979 as an Art director with my last 12 years spent as Creative Director of a leading London agency before heading north. My passion is painting watercolours and producing railway style posters of the beautiful landscape which surrounds us.



TREASURER: Stuart Whatley Edinbane Pottery

I have made a full time living for the last 50 years here at Edinbane Pottery. We make a wide range of stoneware pottery, mostly functional. The work is hand made, we throw most on the wheel, with some hand building. The majority are fired in a large (100 cubic foot) wood fired kiln. But we also make salt glazed ware and use small gas and electric kilns to achieve other finishes. Our work is almost totally sold through our own gallery at Edinbane.

I was a founder member of the Arts & Crafts Association & have enjoyed working with others to help in general support & marketing.



SECRETARY: Beverley Scholefield Handspinner Having Fun

I spin, knit, crochet, felt, dye, blend yarns and fibres and generally try my hand at anything. I have bought a loom and that is my next aim - to learn how to weave. How long have I been crafting? Well... I learned to knit when I was about 9 but it didn't grow fast enough and I found it boring but I picked the skill up again when I was a teenager. I wrote my first knitting pattern when I was 16 as part of my Duke of Edinburgh Award, which was a 'V' neck tank top. In my early 20's I took sewing classes. The ability to understand how sewn garments go together helps a lot with understanding how knitted garments come together. When I bought the shop I thought I should learn to spin... so I had my first lesson October 2013 and have not stopped since. I am addicted and love to spin unusual fibres.



COMMITTEE MEMBER—Cathy Myhill Dandelion Designs

In 1980 I moved to Skye having previously lived and worked in art education and visual resources in the West Midlands. It was a complete lifestyle change but it didn't take long for the magic of the island to reawaken my creativity. Soon after arriving I resumed my own artwork and started selling through local outlets.

I started selling work in locally organised craft markets and later set up my own gallery Dandelion Designs and Images Gallery at Stein. That was almost 30 years ago. I was a founder member of SLACA and being involved has helped me to grow in confidence as an artist. I would like to see other local artists find their feet and develop in the same way that I did and I can't think of any better way than through continuing to work together under the SLACA umbrella...it's even more important now in the current climate!



COMMITTEE MEMBER Liz Myhill Artist

I'm a painter and printmaker originally from Skye and involved in the family business Dandelion Designs and Images Gallery on Waternish. Sadly Skye is no longer my full-time home but I make extended visits throughout the year from my current base near Dunkeld. I've been a member of SLACA for several years but this is my first time on the committee (thanks to the wonders of Zoom meetings) so I'm really looking forward to playing a more active role and seeing how best to support the membership.



COMMITTEE MEMBER—EXHIBITIONS Ian & Gill Williams Studio

I have resided on the beautiful Isle of Skye for 20 years where I have continued to respond to the environment, using clay, paints, words and more recently wood to inform my work.
